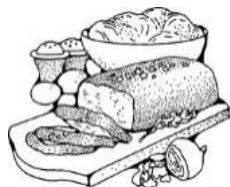

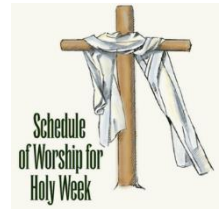
We are looking for a volunteer or two who would be willing to fill and hide Easter eggs for our annual egg hunt. If you are interested, please contact the office for more information.
