This year's Lenten Series is on the Legacy of St. Francis. Fr. Richard Rohr introduces us to an orthodoxy lost to much of contemporary Christianity, an orthodoxy rooted in Franciscan theology and practice, orthodoxy biblically grounded, personally challenging and ultimately liberating. Fr. Rohr is a globally recognized ecumenical teacher bearing witness to the universal awakening within Christian mysticism and the Perennial

Tradition. He is a Franciscan priest and founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation. Fr. Rohr has authored many books and is the academic Dean of the Living School for Action and Contemplation. All are welcome to attend any part(s) of the program you are able.
