

Lenten Program

Wednesdays, February 17-March 23, 5PM

This year's Lenten Series is on the Legacy of St. Francis. Fr. Richard Rohr introduces us to an orthodoxy lost to much of contemporary Christianity, an orthodoxy rooted in Franciscan theology and practice, orthodoxy biblically grounded, personally challenging and ultimately liberating. Fr. Rohr is a globally recognized ecumenical teacher bearing witness to the universal awakening within Christian mysticism and the Perennial Tradition. He is a Franciscan priest and founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation. Fr. Rohr has authored many books and is the academic Dean of the Living School for Action and Contemplation. All are welcome to attend any part(s) of the program you are able. The program will run as follows:

Annual Meeting – Vestry Elections

Sunday, Feb. 14, 2016

One Service-9:00 A.M.

Mark your calendars for the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 14th. We will have one combined service at 9:00 AM with the meeting afterwards. Please bring a covered dish as we will first share a meal together then get to the “business” of the church. The election of four vestry members and one warden will take place at this time. A vestry member’s term is three years; the term for a warden is two years. Not only is the vestry the governing body of the church but it is charged with helping to discern the vision toward which God is drawing St. Paul’s, making it a very important ministry in the life of the church.

Note: The qualifications for voting as set forth in the by-laws of the parish say “Each member, eighteen (18) years of age or older and a communicant in good standing for one calendar year shall be entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote at a meeting of the members.” (Section 5:05) In order to run for an elected office the by-laws say “No person may serve as a Vestry member, unless that person is baptized, at least eighteen (18) years of age, a communicant in good standing of the Parish for one calendar year, and has been a regular financial contributor of record before the election or Vestry appointment takes place.” (Section 3:06)

The following people will be running for Vestry positions;
(1 year) Bill Freeman, (3 years) Ruthie Koerts, Dick Schwab and Bob Pettit.
