Building Maintenance

The Vestry is undertaking two projects to maintain the property and building.

1. We are continuing the landscaping project on the Broad Street side of the Church. The cost of the project is \$6,000.00
2. In order to preserve the life of our stained glass windows in the Church and the Chapel, we are going to replace the existing protective Plexi-glass with an exclusive Klear-flo protective covering system utilizing ¼" acrylic. The cost of the project is \$16,651.00.



#Episcopalians Vote




This November 8, our nation will head to the polls to decide a number of important elections, and there are many opportunities for Episcopalians to engage in this electoral process.
