Building Maintenance

The Vestry is undertaking two projects to maintain the property and building.

1. We are going to continue the landscaping project on the Broad Street side of the Church. This work should be completed sometime in mid-October. The cost of the project is \$6,000.00. It will match the work that has already been completed. The Women of the Church has graciously donated \$500.00 to the landscaping project. We thank the donor who graciously contributed to the first phase of the project.
2. In order to preserve the life of our stained glass windows in the Church and the Chapel, we are going to replace the existing protective plexi-glass with an exclusive Klear-flo protective covering system utilizing ¼” acrylic. The protective covering material will be set into the existing ventilator frames in such a manner that they will remain operational. The current coverings have yellowed with age and do not allow the heat to escape thus increasing the possibility of decreasing the life of the windows. These new protective coverings will increase the beauty of the windows and allow the air to escape. Willet Hauser Architectural Glass, the same company which designed and installed the windows, will be completing the work. Most likely the work will be completed in the spring when the temperatures are more consistent. They have also appraised the windows for current value. The cost of the project is \$16,651.00.

Special Rector's Forum



On October 16th we will have a special Rector's Forum. John Fillo has graciously offered to spend time with us and help us to answer the question: "How Did We Get to Where We are? While technology is a key to unlocking our understanding of modernity, how we got to where we are is a fascinating tale. The Industrial Revolution ushered in humanity's first machine age, progress driven primarily by technological innovations that have led up to the second machine age or computer age.

He will start with an introduction to human history, a brief trip back in time and the questions: What bent the curve of human social development? Was it domestication of animals, farming, writing, mathematics, the printing press or was it something else? The something else that John will introduce is the work of the historian, Ian Morris, and how he measures civilization; how social development decides the fate of nature. What has been cited is included in Morris' social development traits: energy capture per capita; organization; information technology; and war making capacity. It was the coming together of these four traits and the industrial revolution that bent the curve of social development.

After looking at the fundamental characteristics of the first machine age, we will discuss six innovations and their history: glass, cold, sound, cleanliness, time and light, all of which are the heart of the computer age.

John was with us a while ago and his presentation was informative and thought provoking. Please join us for this special topic.
