Wednesday, February 15, Noon

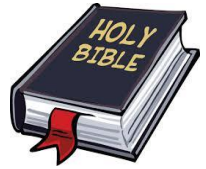

Sunday, February 26th

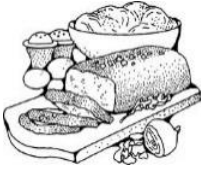

Lenten Program

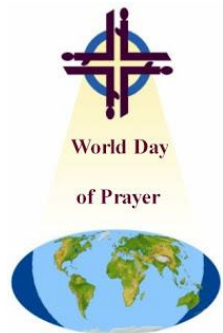
