The Church Office will be closed Tuesday, July 4th in honor of Independence Day. Also, there is no CHOW. We wish everyone a Happy 4th of July!




Movin' On Luncheon

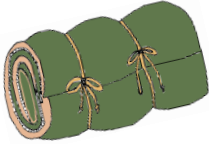
St. Paul's Church Wednesday, August 16th

St. Paul's will be hosting a Life Screening event on Wednesday, August 16th. Life Screening is a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings. There are five non-invasive and painless health screenings that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heartbeat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for both men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening for \$149 (\$139 with our member discount). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. 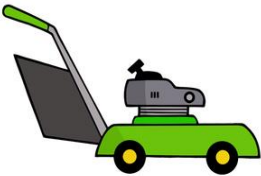
Ice Cream Social
