Fall Clean Up Day

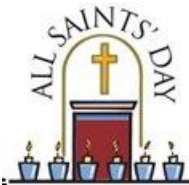
Sunday, November 5th, Noon to 2:00 PM

WOMEN OF CHURCH LIFE OF MOHAMMAD PROGRAM

Saturday, December 2nd

Looking ahead to December, Saweeba Athar of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Mosque on Route 26 in Vestal has invited the Women of St. Paul's to attend a special day of learning about the Muslim faith and the life of the prophet Mohammad, which will be held on Saturday, December 2nd. The program, which will commence at noon, will include interpretation of Mohammad's teaching on education, the role of women and children in their faith, the true meaning of Jihad, and the relationship of Islam with Christianity. Lunch and socialization will follow at 1:00 p.m. and also offer the opportunity to ask questions. This event is open to women from all faith communities so please feel free to bring a friend.
