**Today, Noon to 2:00 PM**



# Blood Drive

## November 22nd



On **November 22<sup>nd</sup>** we will be jointly sponsoring a Red Cross Blood Drive with our sisters from All Saints Episcopal Church and the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community.

The blood drive will be held at All Saints (475 Main Street, Johnson City) from Noon to 5:00 p.m. Yes, this is the day before Thanksgiving but the holiday season always places a high demand on the blood and donors are needed. We will be looking for donors from St. Paul's, as well as volunteers to work the day of the blood drive. Volunteer shifts will be for a minimal period of time in order to leave you with ample time for your Thanksgiving preparations. Granted, this is a busy time for all, but donations of your time and/or blood may save a life in the future. Sign-up sheets for volunteers will be available in the near future as we finalize last minute details. Those wishing to donate may sign up online at the Red Cross website or register the day of the blood drive. Instructions for online registration will be forthcoming. We would also be looking for a few dozen cookies toward the cookie trays we will make available to donors and volunteers throughout the day. As a bonus if you are one of the 1<sup>st</sup> 25 donors you will receive an apple or a pumpkin pie for your Thanksgiving dinner. If you have any questions please contact Dolly Chergosky or me.

**Information for Volunteers:** Volunteer duties will include greeting people, showing them where to sign in, and handing out treats following their donation. Red Cross staff handle all details related to signing in, registration and the actual donation of blood. Volunteer shifts will be for a minimal period of time in order to leave you with ample time for your Thanksgiving preparations. Sign-up sheets for volunteers will be available at the back of the church in early November.

**Information for Donors:** Those wishing to donate may sign up online at the Red Cross website or register the day of the blood drive. Instructions for online registration will be available by the beginning of November.

Are you eligible to donate?

- ✓ You must be at least 17 years of age. There is no upper age limit as long as you are well with no restrictions on your activity.
- ✓ It must be at least 8 weeks since your last donation.
- ✓ Please visit [redcrossblood.org](http://redcrossblood.org) for further information about donating blood and for weight requirements.
