Christmas Decorations

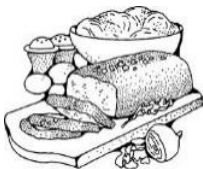

Rector's Forum



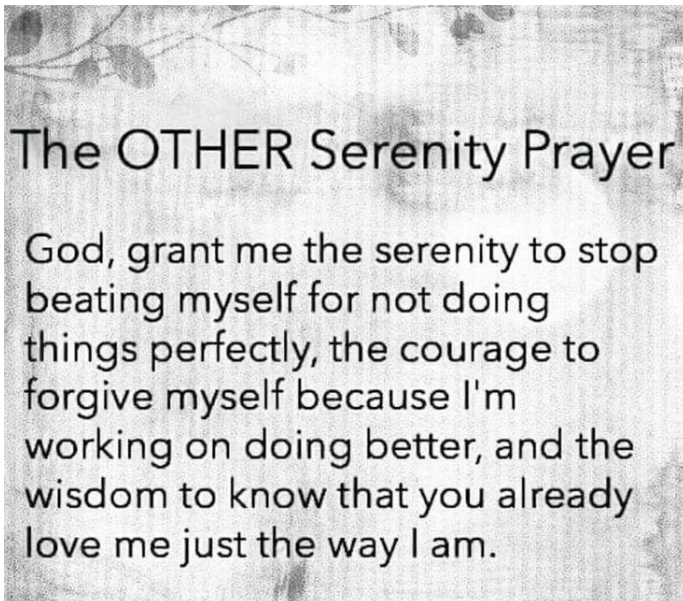
During the month of January, the Rector's Forum will cover "The End of the World or Heaven on Earth" by Michael Battle. This will be on January 21st and 28th.
