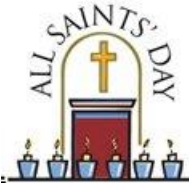

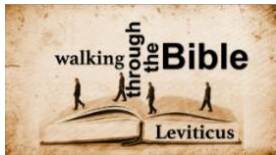
Welcome to St. Paul's
