CPR TRAINING

Wednesday, July 27th



The Women of the Church and the Parish Nurse Program are joining together to sponsor CPR training on **Wednesday, July 27th** in both an afternoon session and an evening session. Training will be open to the entire parish at no cost. Although

there will be no certification at the end of the training, it is very important for you to know how to correctly provide this life saving technique in the event of an emergency. Even if you have previously had CPR training, it is always good to take a refresher course. Training will also include the use of the church's AED (Automated External Defibrillator) to ensure that everyone knows where it is located in the Christian Ed building and how to operate it. For those who are interested, the training will also cover giving CPR to babies and small children.

Each training session will last approximately 2 hours, with a 3rd hour for those who wish to stay to have the babies/small children training after completing the standard CPR/AED training session. Time frames for training are as follows:

Afternoon Session: 1-3 p.m. CPR/AED;
3-4 p.m. CPR/babies & small child (optional)

Evening Session: 6-8 p.m. CPR/AED;
8-9 p.m. CPR/babies & small child (optional)

A sign-up sheet is at the back of the church. Please sign up for the specific time slot you desire (afternoon or evening) and also check whether you are interested in training for babies and small children, in addition to the standard CPR training. It is important that you sign up for the training to enable us to have adequate materials and training staff available.

Recycle your K-Cups



We are still collecting used K-cups for recycling. There is a box in the cloak room and one in the church office. Feel free to save up a bunch then drop them off at church. Or, simply leave a bag outside the Christian Ed door. Once the bin is full, it is shipped by UPS to g2 Revolution, an innovative recycling company. 75% of the cups by weight is converted to compost. 25% of the cups by weight is converted into recycled products.
