Have you ever been witness to a situation that caused you concern, but didn't really know what to do? Did you ever wonder if you should intercede? Should you call 911? Will getting involved escalate the situation further? Could someone be harmed if I don't react – or could it be worse if I do? These were all questions faced by a small group of our

parishioners when we went out for coffee one day, and which we continue to ponder. Our uncertainty was an indication that we needed some guidance, and we were sure we weren't alone. Endicott Police Department Chief Patrick Garey will join us on September 22nd at 1:00 p.m. in the undercroft to address such questions and give guidance on how and when we need to react to formidable situations. This gathering, which is sponsored by the WoC, is open to the entire parish. Even if you haven't encountered a situation like this, you might in the future. We can all benefit by this guidance, and we encourage you all to attend to hear Chief Garey and ask questions that may be of concern to you. **A sign-up is in the back of the church to get a tentative headcount for set up purposes,** however, even if you don't sign up, please come. Coffee, tea and light refreshments will be available.
