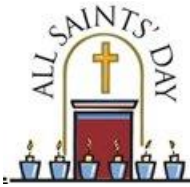

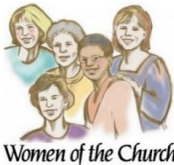

ELDER SERVICES SPEAKER TO DISCUSS MEMORY ISSUES



A parish meeting will be held on Tuesday, **October 18th at 1:00 p.m. in the undercroft**, featuring Rene Conklin, Coordinator of Binghamton University's Elder Services Program. Memory issues are not limited to the aging and can be caused by various conditions. Regardless of age, if we or someone we know is experiencing issues with short or long-term memory loss, or exhibiting changes in their thinking and behavior, it is difficult to know what to do. It may be normal forgetfulness, or it may be something more serious. Ms. Conklin will address cognitive impairment, including the various function levels of dementia and how to preserve remaining function levels. Whether you have concerns for yourself, a family member or a friend – or simply want to learn more about this topic that impacts so many, please join us on the 18th. The meeting is sponsored by the WoC as they continue with their focus on health issues and challenges faced by many of us as we age. A sign-up sheet will be placed at the back of the church; however, if you forget to sign up, please still feel free to attend. Light refreshments will be served.
