Robin will explain all the benefits of this program, which helps mentor children who need extra support and encouragement, while giving the Foster Grandparents a positive and uplifting experience and for some fills the void created by an empty nest or retirement. I would encourage you to attend, even if you think this isn't for you – you may be surprised. Also, the knowledge you gain can be passed on to family and friends and may turn out to be just what someone you know is looking for in their lives. Light refreshments will be served.

As a peek ahead, in December we will hold our annual holiday luncheon giving us time for good food, conversation and laughter.
